Call to order:	Commissioner Cary called the meeting to order at 5:37 p.m.
1. Approval of Minu from June 5 & September 9 Commission Meeti	5, 2019 minutes. Commissioner Lunghi seconded the motion. Motion Passed. Minutes Approved.
2. Review draft of Makerspace Policy Grace LaRochelle, Manager, EFP/FP- November Vote	Grace Larochelle introduced herself to the Commissioners and presented an overview of the new Makerspace Policy to be used at East Forest Park Library. Questions came up about the general policy. Commissioner Moriarty asked questions about the section <i>Becoming</i> <i>a Maker</i> - For children, parents have to sign a release, but do they have to stay with the child? The release has to be signed but they don't have to stay with child if they are over 8 (per Child Safety Policy) A librarian will be scheduled to be in the Maker Space Commissioner Cary asked about the second paragraph under <i>Extending Timeslot</i> whether a 2 hour extension will be granted for the use of the Maker Space if the space is not reserved for another individual



	Will the extension be for 2 hours or until someone else comes? (For example, it would seem like a rather long wait if someone comes 20 mins into your 2 hour extension.) Jean Canosa Albano will look into computer use policy to make them align. (maybe the timeslot will extend 30 mins or an hour)
	There was a note that the following paragraph under <i>Safety</i> , goes from third person to first person.
	Scheduling 1-on-1 training for equipment will be similar to Book-a- Librarian. Commissioner Fyntrilakis made a suggestion that all first time users
	should have to have training before unsupervised use.
	Commissioner Cary assured that all staff will be trained and comfortable with initial user knowledge, the Digital Services librarian will be a resource for staff and the public and Focus Springfield will be available to help further upon need.
	Molly Fogarty suggests scheduling trainings on Saturdays for new users of the community room since it will be available after hours. Jamillah Vernon will contact Plymouth about adding a section for EFP reservations to leave notes if they want training.
	Commissioner Fyntrilakis posed questions about the 3D-printer policy. Commissioner Cary suggested it may be worth adding language that states projects that may take longer will be printed overnight or next day.
	Commissioner Cary entertained the idea of online scheduling Jamillah Vernon to contact Plymouth about adding a 3D printer page for scheduling.
	Overall the Commissioners were pleased with the Draft. A vote will be included in the next Library Commission meeting on November 6 <sup>th</sup> .

5. Director's Report	<ul> <li>Ms. Fogarty thanked Commissioner Cary for the Focus Springfield filming of today's event. The Ribbon Cutting went beautifully with many City and State officials, including the Springfield Historical Commission, the Springfield Preservation Trust, Caolo and Bienek Architects and Kronengberger contractors.etc. Nothing more immediate than seeing people in wheelchairs use the new ramp. East Forest Park is coming along. There was a tour yesterday for City Councilors. 3 were in attendance: Councilors Hurst, Lederman and Whitfield. They were incredibly impressed by the space and design and detail. The construction deadline for completion is October 15<sup>th</sup>. Furniture and shelving will begin arriving the week of October 21<sup>st</sup>.</li> <li>Closing the current East Forest Park branch on November 4<sup>th</sup> to get ready to move. Once the shelving is installed in the new East Forest Park Branch, Sitterly movers will move all of the library materials.
