- There will be a tour of Springfield's Central Cultural District on Monday, March 7. Senator Lesser is hosting and will be joined by Anita Walker of the Massachusetts Cultural Council, and others. The tour will begin in the Central Library Rotunda at 2:30 p.m.
- We are reviewing the final East Forest Park Branch design and will be getting a cost estimate to take to Mayor Sarno.
- There will be an MBLC Workshop on the new construction grant round on March 23 at the South Hadley Library.
- She and Ms. Leaders will meet with Caolo & Bieniek regarding the cost assessment for repairs to the Central Library, including the Quad entrance ramp, the roof and front staircase.



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There will be a Capital Improvement Committee meeting tomorrow, March Access issues are being resolved at the Library Express at Pine Point building. A "buzzer" has installed. We are continuing to work with TSM Design and Nancy Urbschat on our rebranding. Consistency, welcoming and friendly are paramount. The Central Library will soon house the WGBY DVD collection - a recent collaboration with WGBY. The City Auditor's cash-handling audit is in process. Work is continuing on the FY17 budget.
